

This term our topic has been 'As time goes by'. We have been looking closely at the traditional fairy tale, The Three Little Pigs. We have been exploring our communication further this term by looking closely at lists and instructions with the use of visual symbol timelines. This term we have been lucky to go to Longford Park Cycle Track as part of the Enrichment Sessions. The children have really enjoyed having the space to run, explore and of course try out a range of different bikes.













Each week we have also been going out for a walk in the local community. The children have been learning to walk as part a group, hold hands with an adult, cross the road safely and we have even been to the shop! It's been a lovely experience for all the children.

We have read the traditional story 'Three Billy Goats Gruff' and a modern story with a repeated phrase 'Stuck!' - exploring and asking for the resources from the story, drawing pictures from the story with support, matching photos to object to drawings and some of us have been matching words.

In Reasoning we have learnt skills such as filling containers, counting, matching and maths words like off and on, more and less, one, two, lots etc. using a range of toys and maths equipment.









We have worked with **Venture Arts** to explore and develop our skills with clay and are working towards making and decorating a tile each.

Blossom class

This term our topic has been "As time goes by". We have enjoyed reading stories about dragons and knights, each one with a twist in the tale. We have used our stories to help us develop our vocabulary and to ask and answer questions. Some of us have begun to use small computers to practice typing our names. This is an excellent life skill for us to develop.













We have enjoyed our My World lessons which focus on science. We have been looking at things which fly and linked this to animals who fly. We have enjoyed seeing all the unusual animals who fly as well as experimenting

with flying toys.



We continue to think about different festivals which happen throughout the year. We have celebrated the Lunar New Year and Valentine's day this term. We have also enjoyed listening to and making music. We have a good sense of rhythm and enjoy making our own music. We continue to learn how our bodies move and enjoy using the different equipment in the hall to see what we can achieve.

Rose class

This half term Rose class has been working on **changes** and **time** as part of our theme 'As **time goes by**'. We enjoyed exploring different art techniques from the past, from prehistoric to contemporary. The students have been able to explore different textures, items and objects.

For World Book Day we explored books through our sensory story.

Sunflowers class have been exploring the theme 'As Time Goes By' through a range of activities using vintage toys and new technology.

Jasmine class










We have linked Design and Technology sessions to our 'Three Little Pigs' story, creating our very own moving picture fairy tales. We explored levers, sliders and wheels to examine how characters can move and stories can be brought to life. We then chose a scene from 'The Three Little Pigs' that we would like to recreate, and selected either a lever, slider or wheel to develop the moving mechanism.

We have also loved our weekly tennis sessions with Andy from **We Do Tennis**.
The sessions are all inclusive and get all the class moving first thing on a Wednesday morning!







Elm class

This Spring term Elm class have been exploring writing on horizontal surfaces using various writing utensils. They have also been experimenting with sound in our music sessions.



Pupils have been attending Lancasterian schools coffee shop during the spring term. Pupils have been practicing using their waiting skills and communication skills during these sessions.





During this last term, Pine class have been enjoying their creative expression sessions, exploring different instruments and the sounds they create. We found that some of us liked loud sounds and some liked quiet sounds and would choose instruments that would make these sounds.

Some children have been developing their mark making skills using different sensory stimuli and objects. We started off using nonconventional objects such as balls, cars and straws to make marks in sensory stimuli such as foam, glitter and paint. We then moved on to using more conventional objects such as whiteboard pens and paintbrushes using the same stimuli.

Pupils have been working very hard in their 'My Reasoning; covering work about capacity, more and less, and working with numbers to 100.



In their 'My Communication' pupils have enjoyed listening to the 'Tortoise and the Hare' and 'The Princess and the Frog' stories, as well as continuing to develop their own reading skills.



In **Enrichment** we did sensory exploration activities such as making our own lava lamp bottles, making our own slime, playdoh and sensory bags. We have also been very busy doing Eco / gardening activities. We planted some bulbs for Mother's Day and have planted some vegetable seeds to create a vegetable patch in school.



Maple class



This term Maple class has been a hive of activity!

We have been learning about the history of our own city of Manchester. We had a trip to the science and industry museum where we learnt about Industrialization and what jobs children would have done in the past without being able to go to school.

We had a trip to listen to 'Music Live' at the Bridgewater hall and the class really enjoyed listening to different styles of music and joining in with singing.



In maths we have been practising our multiplication and division skills as well as addition and subtraction, using different methods to find answers. We have learnt about length and units of measurement with lots of practical activities.

In English we had a fantastic time reading about and writing our own Greek Myths. We have also been learning about recounts with connections to our history unit this term which is the life of Roman Soldiers!

In the Spring term our class theme has been 'As time goes by'. We have been focusing on pupils discovering a sense of personal history and functional time. We have been using stories that have roots in history and have developed as time has passed. This has included The Three Little Pigs, Little Red Hen, Jack and the Beanstalk and The Hare and the Tortoise. We have been using art, music, movement and reading to help us learn through these stories, focusing on time as we go.







We have been using lots of different resources and games to help us understand number in concrete, pictorial and abstract ways. In space, shape and measures we have been exploring length and weight. Functional time is always a focus within our daily and weekly routines.



This half term Rowan class have been working on their life skills and learning how to follow a sequence to make their own snacks.







Rowan class

We have made pancakes for pancake day. The pupils were able to listen to simple instructions and whisk the flour, milk and eggs to make a mixture.

During our happy café sessions, we have made different types of snacks. We have made our own toast and added our favourite toppings like jam, marmalade, or butter. We then moved on to making cheese quesadillas!








We have also made cheese toasties. The pupils used symbols and pictures to know what ingredients they needed to get.

Students are taking orders, answering queries, and learning to convey professionalism in their service, laying the groundwork for effective communication in the future employment. In the school café, students are learning skills such as communication, employability, social interaction, and listening skills that will empower them and give them skills in all aspects of their futures.

Pupils have been working on the art of recognising and adding up coins. Through hands-on activities and engaging games, our students are immersing themselves in the tactile experience of handling coins, distinguishing between various coins, and understanding their values. Students are discovering the real-world significance of money as they count, sort, and tally coins, they are developing essential skills in numeracy, problemsolving, and critical thinking.





In Oak class we have been focusing on Team work. We have worked together on lots of different projects this term.



We made bird feeders to hang outside our classroom window. It's tricky to use the tools on your own so we had to help each other.

We spilt into 2 teams for our Duke of Edinburgh Award sessions. The first team were working together to fix and refurbish our playground furniture. It was great fun jet washing the bench!



The second team worked together to organise fund raising events for Red Nose Day. They made and sold red noses, helped with a wheelchair rugby tournament and organised and hosted a fabulous 'Lancs has got Talent' show for the whole school. Everyone had a great time and they raised £170!!











It is really great to see how the ideas of the Eco Committee are spreading throughout the school. Lots of children are now getting the opportunity to go outside and use our outside spaces to garden and grow things. We purchased some fantastic wheelchair planters from Emerge who use recycled wood to create these amazing products. It is great to see that they are being used and have some spring onions growing in them. We look forward to tasting them.

We have also been supported by B&Q in Stockport who have very generously given use a selection of plants and seeds to get us started.

Our living wall is now nearly fully planted up in the Peace Garden and has been connected to the watering system so hopefully the plants will survive should it stop raining. Children were able to pot a range of plants and add them to the wall. We have also made some bird feeders to see our feather friends through the winter.

For **Safer Internet Day**, classes across the school looked at Inspiring Change and Making a difference. Pupils looked at how technology has changed over time. Here are some examples from our semi formal and formal classes.

Article 17: (access to information from the media) I have the right to get information in lots of ways, so long as it is safe.



This year's theme for **Holocaust Memorial Day** was Freedom. Cedar class have been looking at the graphic novel Maus, and what life was like in the Ghetto.

Article 2 (non-discrimination) All children have these rights.

Article 6 (life, survival and development) I should be supported to live and grow.

Article 19 (protection from violence, abuse and neglect) I have the right to be protected from being hurt or badly treated.



During Children's Mental Health week, Acorns thought about ways to relax. They tried a 10 minute relaxation session where they got out the bean bags, shut the blinds, turned off the lights and put on some relaxing music. Our rules were: 1. You have to lie down and try to be still 2. You have to stay quiet and try to close your eyes.
