Elm class

This half term our topic has been 'Ourselves'. In my world, the pupils explored various parts of their own body such as their eyes, ears, mouth, feet and head. You can see some of the activities in the photos. All pupils now have a better understanding of some of their body parts, some pupils can name and identify them.



Elm made a class visit to **'Jump Space'** to use their trampolines. Over the course of the hour, all the pupils were able to access the trampoline with support from the 'Jump Space' staff or familiar members of staff. After the visit the class went to McDonald's - they chose their own food, used AAC to communicate their choices, waited in the queue for it to be ready and sat in the restaurant to enjoy it.











Pine Class have been busy this term with the topic 'Ourselves' – we have been exploring with our senses to see, touch, smell, taste and hear. We have been thinking about our own preferences and made a range of food from pizza to noodles, from popcorn to Nutella on toast - dishes from the favourites list of each pupil.

We have read two class books 'Perfectly Norman' and 'What If?' and explored resources around them. We have enjoyed experimenting with water and volume, number songs and naming and matching 2d shapes.

This term in Birch Class we have been to **Withington Café** to help the children learn how to exchange money for a choice of snack. We have also really enjoyed going swimming at **Hough-end leisure centre**. The children have been working on getting themselves changed independently for swimming, gaining confidence within the water and taking turns in the main pool.









In English we have been learning our phonics and been doing some shared reading. In Maths we have been adding one more and finding the missing numbers. We have been giving our Bee-bots instructions in our computing lesson. In music this term we have been trying different musical instruments and following instructions of fast, slow, loud and quiet.

This term Maple have had lots of fun inside and out of the classroom.

In our maths lessons we have been busy measuring length using M and CM and been doing lots of adding and subtracting. In English we have been learning about significant authors such as **Roald Dahl** and **Charles Dickens** and writing diaries as if we were on board the Titanic.









We have been on two fantastic trips, one to the **Science museum** in Manchester as part of our science topic and the other to **Inflata-Nation** for our Christmas trip. Much fun was had by all!

This term we have been getting out and about in our community, exploring the local area and taking part in activities. We have been walking around West Didsbury, including regular visits to the park and high street. We have also been swimming at Hough End Leisure Centre, where children have been developing their water safety and awareness skills, and becoming more confident in the water.

We have been working hard on our topic this term - 'Ourselves', using a mirror to recognise our facial features and taking pictures to identify what we look like. 
Willow class
