Dear Parents and Carers,

It is coming to the end of the Spring Term 2021 and I looked back at my letter for last year's Spring Term newsletter. We had just experienced our first half term of a lockdown and getting to grips with terms like 'Covid', 'pandemic' and 'you are on mute!'. I could never have imagined that 1 year on we would still be in the same position.

However, we have achieved so much in the last year and some of the changes have opened our eyes to new possibilities. I know that I have found virtual online parents' evenings to be much better for me as a parent and that some of you have also appreciated being able to meet with teachers online.

Our spring parents evening was very successful with lots of very positive conversations about how well the children had settled back in to school or were coping with the changes. There was also lots of learning that had happened and our pupils had made progress. I would like to express my own 'Thank you' to all the parents for their support during the most recent lockdown and all your hard work in helping the children to stay engaged with learning.

Despite our Covid restrictions, we have still had some of our usual whole school activities. We took part in the 'World Book Day' again. I really enjoyed seeing the pupils dressed up in their costumes and sharing their favourite books. I was so pleased to be able to go into classes and read to the children again, Cinderella had an extra addition of a PPE mask this year!

We also had some funny costumes for Comic Relief and classes had 'fun' with each other which is much needed at this time.

This year we also had our Easter Bonnet and Egg decorating competitions. We were not able to last year so was lovely to all be in school and to be able to do this again.

I am very conscious of keeping everyone safe in school so our risk assessment is staying the same for after Easter. We are still testing twice a week and there is still lots of handwashing. We have been reading **Jack and the Beanstalk**. We decorated our own beanstalks using lots of different materials. We explored sensory art leaf painting and also planted beans.






Sunflower class

Rose Class have been exploring the theme of "As time goes by" and how things change through the time.










We have worked on **The Ugly Duckling** sensory story and some story and dance massages that have helped us to relax and have fun while we learnt.



In cooking we have been making Easter treats, developing some great independence skills!








Elm class

Birch class


Hello from Birch class!

Maple class


In English we learnt about Myths and Legends focusing on the 'Labours of Hercules', where we used our imagination to create our own mythical setting and creature before writing our own labour. Then moving onto writing recounts in the form of diary entries.

In maths, we have been learning how to tell the time and enjoyed learning transactions of money through role play. Before moving onto place value, multiplication and division.

Whilst having a smaller class during lockdown we embarked on a class project to create a puppet show which you can find on YouTube. The class worked hard to write a storyline, design and create the set and film the production. We also explored our local community during a weekly walk. During Friday enrichment we designed and created carnival games and hosted our own carnival at the end of the half term.

This term our Topic has been "As time goes by".

We have been sharing our activities at home and at school.









In Music we have been enjoying listening to and exploring how music has changed through the decades.

We have also been exploring significant events and trends from over the decades like the Queen's coronation 1953, the Space Race and the bright colours of the 80's.

We have also been exploring how things change over time through tactile exploration with textures that change!











We have been exploring rhythm and pattern by using musical instruments, African drumming and printing with shapes and colours.



This spring term Oak class have started a new English topic focusing on myths and legends. We have been using the text *Percy Jackson and the Lightening Thief* as a base to start creating our own ideas and eventually write our own stories. We have been learning how to improve noun phrases and our writing by using adjectives, similes and metaphors. Green group have been learning about a different book called 'Dragon Slayer', a story about a lone dragon slayer killing a dragon and then having to look after her three baby dragons.

Science Enrichment

This term has been the start of many new beginnings for Oak class with schools re opening again we have welcomed most of our students back. On Fridays we have started our enrichment sessions learning about science and Carrying out experiments within the classroom. So far, we have made parachutes, slime, hovercrafts and tested acids and alkalis. When we made parachutes, we were trying to make them air resistant enough to stop an egg from cracking. We made two designs each but unfortunately none of them were able to stop the egg from breaking. We had a lot of fun and yokes making the parachutes and it was an egg-cellant start to our science enrichment projects!
